Every Monday through Friday, Christopher Willis volunteers at the Food Bank of Delaware as a lead volunteer. Chris assists the Volunteer Coordinators manage the day to day operations of the volunteer room in the Food Bank's Newark warehouse. While other high school students spend their afternoons in front of the TV or computer, Chris spends each afternoon alleviating hunger for the more than one in four Delawareans who depend on emergency food assistance.

The 2011 award recipients participated in such diverse activities as organizing fundraisers, mentoring peers, and making the world a better place for those who live in Delaware as well as abroad. They are representative of Delaware's youth who are making a positive contribution to society and inspiring others to do the same.

Earn an Elective Credit outside the Classroom!


The **Delaware Volunteer Credit**

(**DVC**) is one elective credit used towards graduation. Students who complete 90 hours of community service during their entire high school career are eligible to receive this credit. If you have been volunteering, you may have already fulfilled the requirements to receive this credit and award!

Delaware Volunteer Credit is a
prestigious award that will appear on
your transcript for employers and
college Admissions boards to see!

It's easy to get started!

- 1. Meet with your counselor to go over program and get the necessary forms.
- 2. Visit volunteerdelaware.org or call the Volunteer Resource Center at 1-800-815-5465
- 3. After completing 90 hours of service, submit required verification of service hours to your counselor.
- 4. Your counselor will send the forms to the Office of Volunteerism by April 15.
- 5. The Office of Volunteerism will send you a certificate of completion.
- 6. Upon receipt of the certificate, the school will assign the Delaware Volunteer Credit to your transcript.
